A TIME TO REMINISCE









Dinny Hurley had a very old Vic Teams Shirt from 1989 with a difference on at Shepparton. He was told to 'Please Explain' (didn't know Pauline was there) to which he told us the story of this shirt.

Back in 1989 the Australian Masters was being conducted in Perth & at that time there was the airline strike that was crippling the country (Oh the good ol' days). The Victorian team decided to organise a bus from Essendon airport with the Tasmanians to take them all the way to W.A. Once on board it was announced that 'NO DRINKING ON THE BUS' which was heralded with a lot of bottles opening as soon as the bus got moving.

The bus drivers swapped after leaving Adelaide after midnight, with the first driver sleeping in his bed at the back of the bus. Just before dawn when most were sleeping Dinny commented to his lovely wife, Gail, that he thought the bus was going the wrong way to which she responded with a "Be quiet everyone is trying to sleep & don't be silly. Of course the bus driver knows where he is going" But still the doubt would not leave Dinny, so finally he went up to the driver with his concerns to which the driver agreed that he too thought that he may have been going the wrong way. Yes indeed he was heading back towards Renmark and not to Port Augusta. Not easy finding a bridge over the Mighty Murray!!!! This little mishap set them a good 4 hours behind schedule.

Numerous food and pit stops were required, and at one, Tom Vimpany of Tassie, found he had to run very hard to catch the bus carrying a heavy load of refreshments (you can see him running behind the bus on the shirt). Lucky there was some part of the Nullabour that still had some green grass as the bus had to stop to drain out the toilet tanks. I wonder how long the grass stayed green after that!!!

Unfortunately for Dinny he did not get to play in the event. Shortly after arriving he got a call regarding a sick parent & had to find the best way home. That was another epic for him which had him nearly going home via Singapore, & I don't know how many more stopovers, but eventuated in him getting on a RAAF plane straight home.

The return bus trip back was a very quiet affair, with most suffering from sore limbs and heavy heads, but what a way to go!!!

After that year there was a reunion of all players listed on the shirt for many years after & I am sure the stories got taller & taller as the years went on!!!

Day 1 Tuesday 8th October

Depart Sydney at 10pm on Cathay Pacific flight to Shanghai via Hong Kong.

Day 2 Wednesday 9th October

Arrive in Shanghai mid morning. We are met and transferred to our hotel via the Shanghai Maglev fast train that reaches a peak speed of 431km. In the evening we play our **first Squash match at the Shanghai Racquet Club**. The Club has an inviting and friendly environment away from the Shanghai buzz. After dinner, enjoy a walk along the Bund to see the famous Nanjing Road. The Bund is the cultural section of Shanghai that best represents the blending of ancient and modern influences. This renowned waterfront district is the city's most famous landmark and you will enjoy a feeling of space and openness that you won't find anywhere else in Shanghai.

Day 5 Saturday 12th October

The morning is at your leisure, and you may choose one of many optional tours in and around Shanghai. After checking into the luxurious Renaissance Hotel, we enjoy an easy and relaxed night in Beijing.

Day 7 Monday 14th October

After breakfast we take a city tour including Tiananmen Square and the Forbidden City. You can also take the chance to visit Chairman Mao's resting place where his body is preserved behind glass. From Tiananmen Square we enter into the Forbidden City, a massive complex that was the centre of the Ming and Qing dynasties. We then begin our tour of the hutongs. A hutong is an ancient city alley or lane typical in Beijing, where hutongs run into the several thousand. The 798 Art Village, is the Beijing "Greenwich Village" or "Soho", a part of Dashanzi in the Chaoyang District of Beijing that house a rich artist community. Afterwards we visit the new icons in Beijing, the 2008 Olympic venues of the Bird's Nest and the Water Cube. Early evening we play our **final Squash match** at the **East Lake Squash Club**. Afterwards you may like to visit the Houhai (Shichahai) district, Beijing's newly developed old town. This area on the lake is home to about 100 restaurants, small bars and pubs with character and funky nightlife. With the glow of lights over the lake, Hohai takes on an unreal feeling. A great place for dinner and then migrate from place to place for drinks, or a nice stroll with lots of people watching. A mixture of old Beijing and the modern west, Houhai is worth a look.

Day 9 Wednesday 16th October

An early breakfast will be followed by a bus trip to the Great Wall of China. Today you will experience the splendor of the Great Wall, the pride of China and one of the Seven Wonders of the World. It is an amazing man-made structure built over 2000 years ago to protect China from northern invaders. In the early evening you can experience the famous Acrobatic Show. The Beijing Acrobatic Troupe is not to be missed and frequently tours internationally. Afterwards we will enjoy our Farewell Dinner of typical Beijing cuisine to celebrate a wonderful tour.

Day 10 Thursday 17th October

Today is free for you to catch up on any last minute shopping or sight-seeing. In the late afternoon we transfer to the airport for our flight home, or for those flying to Xian for 2 nights.

This season has had minimal controversy, by this I refer to player conduct or more pointedly "conduct unbecoming" those who play this sport, representing not only themselves, their club and indeed the VMSA Competition. Remember the VMSA prides itself not only on the high standard of the competition but also on the congeniality in which it's members are represented (both on and off court).

The finals give no reason for behaving any differently – so be "COOL" under pressure.

Something that I have not referenced to in prior newsletters is the condition of venues. This season has seen (1) a number of injuries caused by slippery court surfaces and (2) a number of complaints directed at the conditions of the venue/s. Whilst the VMSA does not advocate standards for court venue operators/owners, it goes without saying that venues should at all times be of an appropriate standard to ensure complete safety as well as providing a comfortable and congenial surrounding for players and visitors. It's my view that venue operators/owners, for their own protection, need to have an appropriate level of public liability and should ensure as a minimum, that prior to anyone participating in sport at their premises that:

- Court floors are swept and damp mopped prior to game commencement, and repeated if necessary at player request or if signs of slipping are evident
- Clear line markings
- Provide clean amenities for changing attire, washing and toilets
- Provide adequate refreshments facilities where drinks can be purchased
- Have available a properly filled first aid kit "cold packs for sprains etc."
- Have appropriate lighting
- Adequate cooking facilities / utensils / tables & chairs
- Adequate access minimum clutter

Michelle Martin awarded an OAM

10 Jun 2013 -

Australian squash great Michelle Martin added another title to her name when she was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) on the Queen's Birthday Honours List.


Michelle, who was recognised as a Legend in the Squash Australia Hall of Fame in 2011, was one of the country's most prolific athletes on the international squash scene.

She won three consecutive world titles in 1993, 94, and 95, and clinched six straight British Open crowns – in 1993, 94, 95, 96, 97 and 98.

She also held the world No.1 ranking from 1993-95 and again in 1999.

This domination overflowed into her Australian representational duties, competing at six World Women's Team's Championships in 1987, 90, 92, 94, 96 and 98.

Michelle also competed for Australia at the 1998 Kuala Lumpur Commonwealth Games winning two gold medals in the women's singles and the mixed doubles.



In addition to her outstanding international prowess she won seven Australian Open Championships – in 1991, 93, 94, 95, 96, 98 and 99.

Michelle continued her commitment to Australian squash in the coaching field after she retired from the world tour, taking on roles with the AIS and acting as manager and coach of Australian junior and senior women's teams from 2003-2010.

She still plays competition squash and coaches juniors in Sydney.

Inducted into the Australian Sports Hall of Fame - Best Team, 1998 and 2009

Inducted into the Women's Squash Association Hall of Fame, 2000

Inducted into the World Squash Federation Hall of Fame, 2001

Inducted into the Queensland Sports Hall of Fame in 2009

Inducted into the NSW Sports Hall of Champions, 1998
