# **PENNANT DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

We are ½ way through the Spring '13 season and a 'short season' at that. Your committee continues to trial new things during the "home & away" competition without impinging upon the inherent principles and standards of the V.M.S.A.

In the latter part of this year we have:

- Opted for a shorter season on the lead up to the XMAS period which has been well received by members.
- Another innovation has been the introduction of a "split" grade in Grade 1. Grade 1 consists of an 8 team draw with two distinct divisions – the strong teams in division one [ladder positions 1–4] and the others [ladder positions 5-8]. This permits ease of keying and allows all players to contest the finals playoffs. Whilst it has generated humorous discussion at the supper table, it waits to be seen what level of competitiveness befalls when the finals arrive. Light-hearted conjecture over what may happen with teams in 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> position just prior to the final round – **No tanking guys!!!!**
- The V.M.S.A. has also circulated a questionnaire to all participating clubs in the Spring '13 season; the purpose of which is to gauge your views on the structure of the pennant format as well as to get feedback on any new ideas. For your voice to be heard, please take the time to complete this form and give it back to your club co-ordinator.

# World Masters Games Turin Italy 2013

The 8<sup>th</sup> World Masters Games were held in Turin Italy from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> August 2013. The games attracted over 19000 competitors in 30 sports including squash. In addition, there were over 15,000 registered partners and supporters, who in total, contributed significantly to the local economy and were given free access to the public transport systems across the city.

The games take place every four years with Australia having played a major role, with Brisbane hosting the 1993 games, Melbourne in 2001 and Sydney in 2009. The 2017 games are planned for Auckland. Interestingly, but not surprisingly, Australia had the most representatives in Turin, followed by Canada.

In the squash section, the number of entrants totaled 128 across all age groups, with Australia providing 26, again the major contributor in spite of our remote location. The relatively low entry numbers from Italy, said to be due to the high cost of entry, was a reminder both of the tough economic conditions being experienced by many European countries, and the relative strength of the economy we have in Australia.

The squash was concentrated at the one centre, mainly on 2 glass back courts and the organizers provided a qualified referee to look after marking and refereeing duties. The 11 points per game scoring system was used, which we found different but manageable.

It was quite a shock to go from the middle of Melbourne's winter at 14 degrees, to the middle of summer in Italy at up to 41 degrees on one memorable ( forgettable ) day. Avoiding playing too many short shots was an ongoing challenge mentally as well as the physical challenge of much longer rallies, with the ball bouncing prodigiously. In the men's over 70's, the top 5 seeds played a round robin and unsurprisingly, the combatants were all friends from previous international tournaments. They seldom come out of the woodwork after 70!

My opponents were from Canada, USA, England and South Africa, so quite an international flavour. My effort in winning 2 out of 4 matches earned me a bronze medal. The Canadian won all matches comfortably. I beat him in Melbourne in 2001.

That's squash!

# VALE KAYE KAY

It is with much sadness to announce that the VMSA lost a dear and long time member of our association. Kaye Kay passed away peacefully in the early hours of Friday 20/9/13 after a long battle with cancer.

KK burst on to the master's scene at the Swan Hill Tournament in April 1989 and loved it so much she was a devotee there and then. I think this might have also been the first foray for the Booze Brothers, and possibly it was where KK met Maureen, who became a lifelong friend for the first time, & was her carer in the last few weeks of KK's life. It was either then, or at the Bendigo Tournament a little later that year.

KK loved VMSA pennant as well as her mid-week pennant and was a strong motivator for her teams and her clubs – significantly at Lower Plenty which morphed into Westerfolds, and originally at Diamond Valley midweek Ladies.

KK's foray into the Australian Master's Championships was the 1989 memorable bus trip to and from Perth courtesy of the Pilot's strike. We published the story about it in the last newsletter. As per John Sandler's delightful tee-shirt design, we boozed, er snoozed across to Perth via Renmark.

Her appearance at the 1991 Championships in Darwin was not quite the height of her courage, that came later, but it was an open and defiant display of her fortitude and courage. After her initial mastectomy, she was determined to play in those Championships.

KK brought light and movement and colour in all her matches, both pennant and tournaments. Many Squashies will have wonderful and funny memories, and we can see KK figuratively zipping her lips and saying that "some secrets will stay secret."

One story we can relate comes from one of the early 1990's Sale Tournaments where a new couple were making their first appearance namely Terry & Wali. Upon being introduced to KK at the Friday night supper, she greeted Terry with "thank God there's some new talent" and she didn't mean his squash abilities.

KK was on the VMSA Committee for some time and held positions as Editor of the His Masters' Voice Newsletter, general member and Tournament Committee Member and loved working on the desk which she dealt with all with her usual good sense of humour and dedication.

KK tried other activities away from squash, including a successful go at paragliding. That led to a desire to try parachuting, but her battle with that damned barbed wire fence was not an equal battle, not one on equal footing, and this led to KK ultimately having to give up playing squash. However, that did not stop KK attending our country tournaments and the Australians, livening up the goings on. Even the last year or so when it took a lot of effort for her to get up and going, she still graced us with her bubbly self.

A small personal reflection is from Wali and Terry, and undoubtedly this could apply to all KK's friends. "KK infectiously came into our life and was just always a part of it somehow. Whether as a competitor on the court, conversations, having fun and a sharing a joke & smut, or visiting them in Rye....she was just always there.....full of love and life, just joyously participating."

Such was KK's strength and determination that she hung on to life to witness her eldest son, Trevor get married.

It was mentioned at KK's funeral how there were probably more Masters Squash players here in attendance than our AGM.

We shall more than miss our KK and the world will be a lesser place. Our collective thoughts are for her family overall and in particular for her beloved boys – Trevor and Stephen.

Wali has written a most beautiful and fitting poem:

*Our gorgeous KK now at peace,  
No pain, no medicine, illness ceased.  
Gone back home to a most wondrous place,  
With poise and dignity – full of grace.  
Dancing above us dressed in a rainbow robe,  
With colourful dangling earrings in each lobe.  
A smile that's beaming from ear to ear,  
Knowing now there's nothing to fear.*

*Having given this life, family & friends all her love,  
Kaye now sends it to us from above.  
Her current vibration of unconditional love and light,  
Can see Kaye grinning with absolute delight.  
The joy of knowing we shall meet again,  
Allows us to keep going here on Earth without our  
gorgeous friend*


