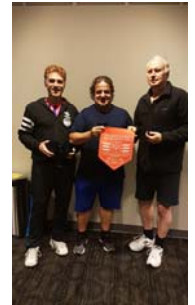

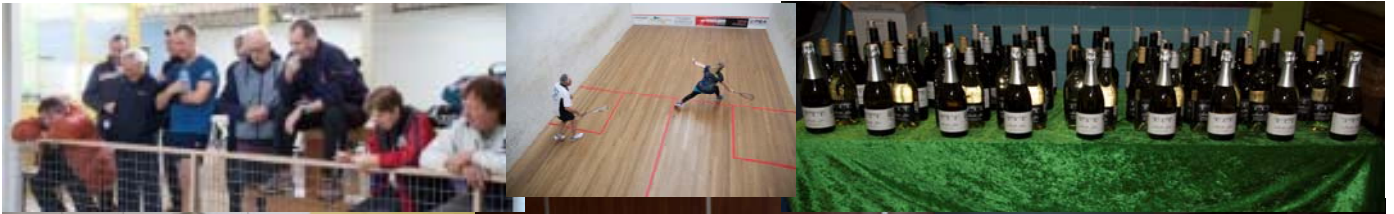

over the whole top floor of the restaurant. What a great evening, so thanks all the interstate people who came and made the evening very special for all.

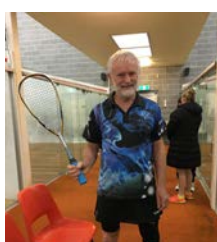
