JOHN AND ANNE LINK -FEBRUARY 2022

\$10,000 donation to the VMSA

John and Anne Link have had a lifetime passion for Squash and Royal Tennis. At the recent VMSA Ballarat tournament, John and Anne donated \$10,000 to the VMSA which I can honestly say was extremely generous and completely unexpected. I want to share John's story about his successful business career, how squash played a role in it's success and the reasons behind his sponsorship of our sport which receives token financial recognition for those who are involved or participate in it.

John started playing squash socially over 50 years ago at Albert Park. He would at best describe himself as a player of average ability. He became tired of being beaten in all of his social encounters so spent two years being coached by Brendan Woodford. During this time Brendan would not allow John to play at competition level fearing he would become unhappy about losing all the time and risk giving up on squash. That was not to be. John's first match was against a similar standard player who happened to be a chemical engineer. After the match John was invited to do some problem solving for his opponent. The opportunity led to a successful business relationship that assisted his own family business for the next 10 years. Other successful relationships were forged through John's love of squash. In particular with Exon who needed help to find cracks underwater on oil rigs. John then travelled to Bombay to meet with the MD of a contracting firm to work offshore. During the meeting John noticed the man had a squash racket behind his desk which resulted in them spending the afternoon playing at the prestigious Bombay Gym Courts. The squash courts had extremely high ceilings and if you see John play and serve, you will easily understand their relevence. Once again this meeting led to John starting up a branch in the United Arab Emirates and burying pipelines in the Red Sea for Saudi Arabia. Moving forward and some 30 years ago, John started playing squash at the Tanglin Club and operated a fire fighting branch which assisted with putting out fires on oil rigs in the South China Sea. He has since been sponsoring the Jumbo Squash doubles event there for over 20 years.

One of John's passions has been supporting Squash where, on two occasions - in 2009 and again in 2017 he has been one of the main sponsors of the Australian Masters Championships conducted by the VMSA in Victoria. In John's words, sponsorship is for love as it has never got his business an order through sponsoring in 40 years. There have been numerous occasions where John and his business Link Pumps have lent support to squash via sponsoring of professional players or developing juniors as well as contributing to costs of clothing and merchandise and financial support for other major squash events held in Victoria. It is a blessing to have someone so generous and supportive of our sport.

John has been married to Anne for 46 years and again in his words says he is as happy as you can be after that amount of time. Through the years John and Anne have both played and enjoyed squash and royal tennis and have even played doubles together. Anne was also World Doubles Champion at Royal Tennis once upon a time.

John's hobby has always been pumps and engineering and the business of 62 years is winding down and drawing to a close. However, it has given him the opportunity to give something back and along the way meet many fabulous people and make great friends.

TOURNAMENT CONDITIONS AND INFORMATION

- 1. The Victorian Championships is an **aged** event, you must be 35 years of age or over to enter. The Tournament will be conducted using triple plate or round robin draws depending on the number of entries received. Scoring will be PAR15 for all sections. All matches will be best of 5 games and every effort will be made to ensure that each entrant gets at least three matches.
- 2. Tournament Entry Fees are \$50 for Non-Members, \$40 for VMSA Financial Members and \$35 for VMSA Financial Members who have played 25+ tournaments. Early Bird rate offers a discounted entry fee for online entries received 2 weeks before the tournament start date.
- 3. Players may enter ONE EVENT ONLY. Players can nominate to play in the open or graded section of their age group, see entry form for details.
- 4. All players must fulfil their obligations to other participants by competing in all matches set down for them.
- 5. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to accept, decline or re-grade any entries.
- 6. Notice of withdrawal and requests for refund must be made to the Tournament Director 7 days prior to the tournament start date. Any requests for refunds after this date are at the discretion of the Tournament Committee.
- 7. No claims whatsoever will be recognised should any player receive an injury whilst participating in the tournament.
- 8. First round matches will be available on our website www.vmsasquash.com.au from Wednesday 6th April 2022.
- 9. All players must report to the Tournament Control Desk at least 30 MINUTES BEFORE their next scheduled match. It is your responsibility to check the draws for your next scheduled match time.
- 10. All players are expected to be warmed up and ready to play as soon as the previous match is completed. Warm up time is 2 mins per side, 4 mins in total and 90 seconds between games.
- 11. All players are expected to mark or referee the match immediately following their own, or as directed by the Tournament Control.
- 12. Medal presentations will be at approximately 4:30pm Sunday followed by a complimentary supper.
- 13. A social get together, including complimentary supper will be held at the Corio Squash Club on Friday evening after the conclusion of the matches. ALL WELCOME
- 14. Snacks and refreshments will be available at the squash centre during the weekend.
- 15. A Dinner Dance will be held on Saturday 9th April at The Leopold Sportmans Club, 135 Kensington Rd, Leopold VIC from 7:30pm till 12:00am featuring a live band and a 3 course meal. Drinks at bar prices. Cost: \$50 per person. PLEASE INCLUDE PAYMENT WITH YOUR ENTRY.
- 16. A Courtesy Bus will be provided to the Dinner, Cost: \$10 per person. PLEASE INCLUDE PAYMENT WITH YOUR ENTRY. You will be advised of the pickup times on Saturday. Any queries contact Michelle Rowles on 0407 838 572.
